

2022-2023 Program Requirements (77.5 - 94 Credit Hours)

Licensure: This program meets the educational requirements designed to lead to an occupationally required professional license or certificate in the state of Utah. Students pursuing occupations requiring a license or certificate in a state other than Utah should contact the appropriate BYU academic advisement center as well as the licensing agency in the state where they intend to work to seek information and guidance regarding licensure and certification requirements.

This major is designed to prepare students to teach in public schools. In order to graduate with this major, students are required to complete Utah State Office of Education licensing requirements. For students accepted into the major after December 16, 2019, grades below C in any required coursework in a teaching major or teaching minor will not be accepted. Students will also be responsible for any additional requirements imposed by the state prior to their graduation. Graduation and Utah licensure cannot be processed until these requirements have been completed.

THE DISCIPLINE

The Department of Teacher Education provides a program that licenses secondary teachers for public schools. In addition to content courses in the field(s) in which they plan to teach, students complete professional education courses and practicum experiences that prepare them to teach in a secondary school setting.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

The Social Science Teaching program prepares students for education related careers. Those who meet all requirements graduate with a Utah teaching license that is also recognized provisionally by most other states. Social Science Teaching majors are certified to teach history, geography, economics, political science, psychology, sociology, and anthropology in secondary schools. They are also prepared to work in curriculum development, as educational consultants in museums and at historic sites, and in other social studies education related careers.
