In addition, students must pass the PPAT assessment to graduate and receive a teaching license. Students will also be responsible for any additional requirements imposed by the state prior to their graduation. Graduation and Utah licensure cannot be processed until these requirements have been completed.

History credit (Hist 199R or 399R) may be available for students whose employment qualifies as applicable work experience in a historical field. Students should contact the department for information.

## HONORARY SOCIETIES AND CLUBS:

Students may be eligible for membership in Phi Alpha Theta, the History Honor Society. Contact the History Department for information.

## FINANCING:

Many students work up to 20 hours per week
some find employment in campus offices and some junior and senior students obtain teaching or research assistantships. Most of our students obtain summer jobs that make use of their training and interests.

## CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

The History Teaching program prepares students for education
related careers. Those who meet all requirements graduate with a Utah teaching license that is recognized provisionally by most other states. History Teaching majors are certified to teach history, political science, and financial literacy courses in Utah secondary schools. They are also prepared to work in curriculum development, as educational consultants in museums and at historic sites, and in other history education related careers.
