

December 2, 1918: “Influenza Ban Gives Impetus to Home Study,” *University of Utah Student Newspapers*

This article is from a student newspaper at the University of Utah. Calling the influenza ban an “impetus” for home study means that the ban made home study more popular. [Changed for easier reading.]

The extension division of the University of Utah is promoting taking classes by mail, and many people are registering for this kind of study.

Studying by mail is legal under the Board of Health’s orders, and it is seen as a way of using the time stuck at home during the epidemic for learning instead of wasting it.

The university reminded students that with the war going on, all students should stay on top of their coursework, perform their duties to their country, and develop their talents. The courses offered through mail are in subjects designed to help in the war effort.
