Is the proposed Canyonlands National Park too big? The proposer, Secretary of Interior Steward Udall, doesn't feel so. If anything, he would like to make it even larger.

He would like to do something nice for Utah. He would like to preserve some of the most fantastic scenery in the nation in the National Park system.

Originally, early last summer, the secretary's office talked in terms of one million or more acres for the Canyonlands National Park.

They agreed to a limit of about 300,000 acres.

He stated that the idea proposed by Gov. Clyde and Senator Bennett of limiting the park to a few isolated overlooks is a concept wholly different from the purpose of the National Park System and over the long run it would surely mean the abuse of important scenic places in this area of extraordinary beauty.
